## United States Air Force

The U. S. War Department created the first antecedent of the U. S. Air Force in 1907, which through a succession of changes of organization, titles, and missions advanced toward eventual separation 40 years later. In World War II, almost 68,000 U. S. airmen died helping to win the war; only the infantry suffered more enlisted casualties. In practice, the U.S. Army Air Forces (USAF) was virtually independent of the Army during World War II, but officials wanted formal independence. The National Security Act of 1947 which established the USAF was signed on 26 July 1947 by President Harry S. Truman.

Today's Air Force predecessor organizations Signal Corps Aeronautical Division, Aviation Section, Division of Military Aeronautics; U. S. Army Air Service; U. S. Army Air Corps, and U.S. Army Air Force.

The United States Air Force and it's predecessor organizations have been involved in may wars, conflicts and operations using military air operations. These actions include World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Operation Eagle Claw (1980 Iranian hostage rescue), Operation Urgent Fury (1983 US invasion of Grenada,), Operation El Dorado Canyon (1986 US Bombing of Libya), Operation Just Cause (1989-1990 US invasion of Panama), Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm (1990-1991 Persian Gulf War), Operation Southern Watch (1992-2003 Iraq no-fly zone), Operation Deliberate Force (1995 NATO bombing in Bosnia and Herzegovina), Operation Northern Watch (1997-2003 Iraq no-fly zone), Operation Desert Fox (1998 bombing of Iraq), Operation Allied Force (1999 NATO bombing of Yugoslavia), Operation Enduring Freedom (1001—present Afghanistan War), Operation Iraqi Freedom and New Dawn (2003-2011 Iraq War), Operation Odyssey Dawn (2011 Libyan no-fly zone), Operation inherent Resolve (2014-2015 intervention against the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant), and Operation Atlantic Resolve (2015 NATO defence of Europe).

USAF has also taken part in numerous humanitarian operations such as Berlin Airlift 1948-1949, Operation Safe Haven 1956-1957, Operations Babylift, New Life, Frequent Wind and New Arrivals, 1975, Operations Provide Comfort and Sea Angel in 1991, Provide Hope 1992-1993, Provide Promise, 1992-1996, Unified Assistance December 2004-April 2005, Unified Response 14 January 2014 to present, Tomodachi, 12 March 2011— 1 May 2011. ## United States Coast Guard

The United States Coast Guard (USCG) is a branch of the United States Armed Forces. The Coast Guard was created by Congress on 4 August 1790 at the request of Alexander Hamilton as the "Revenue Marine", to collect customs duties in the nation's seaports. By the 1860's, the service was known as the U.S. Revenue Cutter Service.

The modern Coast Guard dates to 1915, when the Revenue Cutter Service merged with the U.S. Life-Saving Service when Congress formalized the existence of the new organization, In 1939, the Lighthouse Service was brought under the Coast Guard's purview. 1942 saw the Bureau of Marine Inspection and Navigation transferred to the Coast Guard. In 1967, the Coast Guard moved from U.S. Department of Treasury to the newly formed U.S. Department of Transportation. It was placed under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in 2003 as part of 2003 legislation designed to more effectively protect American interests following the terrorist attacks of September 11th.

In wartime, individual components of the Coast Guard can operate as a service of the Department of the Navy. The arrangement has broad historical basis, as the Coast Guard was involved in the War of 1812, Mexican-American War and the American Civil War, in which the cutter Harriet Lane fired the first naval shots attempting to relieve besieged Fort Sumter. The last time they operated as a whole within the Navy was in World War II. More often, military and combat units within the Coast Guard will operate under the Navy or joint operational control while other Coast Guard units will remain under the Department of Homeland Security.

While no the oldest search and rescue (SAR) it is one of the Coast Guard's best known missions. They are the federal agency responsible for maritime SAR operations, and the United States Air Force is responsible for inland SAR. Both agencies maintain rescue coordination centers and have responsibility for both military and civilian search and rescue. The two service jointly provide instructor staff for the National Search and Rescue School that trains SAR mission planner and coordinators.

#### **Cemetery Report**

It's "FALL IN THE GRAVEYARDS", A TIME FOR WEEDS TO DIE! But things are very alive in our research department. We have five cemeteries that are in or around new development. The Walker Cemetery on U.S. 27, the Cravens on Brannon Pike, and the Bourne cemetery on Main. We were able to gain access to the old Griffing family cemetery located on new property acquired by Camp Nelson. We have uncovered the old stones and hope to repair and reset them soon. This cemetery predates Camp Nelson, with the earliest burial in 1809, Jasper Griffing a Revolutionary soldier. The 5th cemetery is located on Historic Chaumiere farm on Catnip Hill. (See below). Much of Jessamine County's history remains in our old sometimes forgotten graveyards. We may lose many of our old homes and landmarks with the changing times, but I feel it is very important to protect the resting place of those who separated us from Fayette and made us Jessamine.
